The Road to Becoming an Architect (part 3)



After an applicant has completed their experience and internship requirements, the next step is to complete a professional exam.

The State of Idaho Architectural Registration Board, under Title 54-302 <http://www.legislature.idaho.gov/idstat/Title54/T54CH3SECT54-302.htm> requires an applicant to successfully complete passage of all examination divisions of the Architectural Registration Examination (ARE) administered by the National Council of Architectural Registration Board (NCARB). Fifty-four member boards of the United States and provincial and territorial associations of Canada have adopted the ARE. The exam concentrates on those services that most affect the public health, safety, and welfare. The exam focuses on content that relates to the tasks an architect encounters in practice and consists of seven divisions that include multiple-choice, fill-in-the-blank, and check-all-that-apply questions as well as graphic vignettes.

The ARE includes the following seven divisions:

- 1. Programming, Planning, & Practice** - The application of project development knowledge and skills relating to architectural programming; environmental, social, and economic issues; codes and regulations; and project and practice management.
- 2. Site Planning & Design** - The application of knowledge and skills of site planning and design including environmental, social, and economic issues, project and practice management.
- 3. Building Design & Construction Systems** - The application of knowledge and skills of building design and construction, including environmental, social, and economic issues, project and practice management.
- 4. Schematic Design** - The application of knowledge and skills required for the schematic design of buildings and interior space planning.
- 5. Structural Systems** - Identification and incorporation of general structural and lateral force principles in the design and construction of buildings.
- 6. Building Systems** - The evaluation, selection, and integration of mechanical, electrical, and specialty systems in building design and construction.
- 7. Construction Documents & Services** - Application of project management and professional practice knowledge and skills, including the preparation of contract documents and contract administration.

Before scheduling the ARE, the candidate must transmit their NCARB Record to the Idaho State Registration Board, and after approval of eligibility, receive an "Authorization to Test" letter from the testing agency. The "Authorization to Test" letter includes the candidate's name, address, identification number, registration board, and all divisions the candidate is eligible to take. The tests, content, and candidate management is under the direction of Alpine Testing Solutions, Inc.; while the site management is under the direction of Prometric. Each division cost is a non-refundable fee of \$210.

The ARE is offered year round; and in the State of Idaho, Prometric has two locations in Pocatello and Meridian. For the convenience of the candidates in northern and mid Idaho, there is a Prometric in Spokane, Washington and in La Grande, Oregon.

After taking the ARE, the results are processed within four to six weeks and then sent to Idaho State Registration Board. All divisions of the ARE must be completed within 5 years.



CE Requirement Change

Beginning January 1, 2014 all licensees will need to certify on their renewal forms that they have obtained 12 hours of Continuing Education credits in architectural health, safety, and welfare in the prior calendar year (Rule 450). The audit period will then be the previous calendar year. For example, if you submit your renewal form on 7/15/2014, your audit period will be from 1/1/2013 through 12/31/2013. If you have more than 12 hours, you may now carryover a maximum of 6 hours instead of 8 to meet the next year's continuing education requirement.
