



IDAHO BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY

Dear Licensee:

The Idaho Board of Cosmetology would like to update you on a few law and rule changes approved by the 2014 Idaho Legislature and to remind you about the 2013 rule change that clarified Rule 800.11, animals in shops. The 2014 Idaho Legislature approved the following changes to the Board's laws:

- Added a license exemption for a person practicing on a relative without compensation (Idaho Code § 54-804(4)).
- Clarified the practice of an apprentice (Idaho Code § 54-807).
- Clarified the school representative member of the Board (Idaho Code § 54-829).

The 2014 Idaho Legislature also approved the following changes to the Board's rules:

- Added a definition for "clinical services" at Rule 010.17: "Clinical services mean performing hands on acts or techniques within the scope of practice of a profession regulated by the Board."
- Lowered fees at Rule 125.
- Amended Rule 500.02.b to clarify when a student can provide clinical services: "Students may not render any clinical services to patrons until the student has completed at least five (5%) of the required hours of instruction. All work done on patrons must be completed by students and supervised by instructors."

Please remember that the 2013 Idaho Legislature amended Rule 800.11 to clarify the definition of "service animals" in shops:

Each shop and school shall have a clearly identifiable first-aid kit readily accessible on the premises. No animals are allowed in shops or schools except service dogs trained to do work or perform tasks for persons with disabilities. The definition of service animals and disabilities shall be as set forth in U.S. Department of Justice Regulations at 28 C.F.R. Section 36.104 effective March 15, 2011.
