Gregg Sturtevant called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

MINUTES

Mary McGown moved to approve the July 16, 1999 minutes. Dell Hatch seconded the motion, motion carried.

GRADING AND DRAINAGE ISSUE

Roger Hales addressed the City of Moscow Ordinance that was adopted regarding stormwater runoff control. Mr. Hales spoke to Randal Fifth, Moscow City Attorney regarding this ordinance. The Board was successful as this ordinance states, "that a stormwater runoff control facility shall be designed by a person duly licensed by the State of Idaho to design such a facility." Landscape Architects have the right to generally interpret their own scope of practice.

The Cities of Coeur d'Alene, Post Falls and Moscow have taken the stand that licensed landscape architects can do grading & drainage. Mr. Hales suggested that ASLA repetition Boise City sending in this new information to the Boise City Attorney.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Thomas Limbaugh presented the Board the finance report indicating a balance of \$23,523.86 as of November 1, 1999. Direct and indirect costs are being adjusted to being fairer to the smaller boards.

CONTRACT

Thomas Limbaugh presented the Board the new contract written by the Attorney General's office. Mary McGown moved to empower the chair to sign the contract on behalf of the board. Dell Hatch seconded the motion, motion carried.

INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

John Kersey presented the investigative report showing that no complaints have been received for 1999.

CLARB REPORT

Gregg Sturtevant was elected as Regional Director for Region 5. CLARB will pay his way to the national meetings and this will leave money available for another board member to attend these meetings. Mr. Sturtevant gave a report from CLARB. One of their projects is called Outreach 2000, which will be focusing on sending a spokesperson to the Universities explaining what licensure for landscape architects is all about and encouraging students to start a CLARB record. Continuing Education for landscape architects will also be encouraged. Twelve states now require continuing education and eight more will be starting.

Mr. Sturtevant discussed with the board adopting a code of ethics and implementing continuing education for landscape architects.
